### Interprovincial Journeyperson Examination Information

<b>Apprentice Requirements:</b>	4 years and 6000 hours
<b>Tradesperson Requirements:</b>	6 years and 9000 hours
<b>Practical Examination:</b>	No

The interprovincial (IP) journeyperson examination for this trade is developed by a national committee of worker and employer representatives. The content for IP Examinations is drawn from the National Occupational Analysis (NOA) for that trade, and is based on industry's standards and expectations. You can download and print a free copy of the NOA from the Red Seal website by visiting [www.red-seal.ca](http://www.red-seal.ca).

To write the interprovincial journeyperson examination, you must either successfully complete an apprenticeship training program or meet tradesperson eligibility requirements. The pass mark is 70%.

Subject	Percent
<b>Common Occupational Skills:</b> performs safety-related functions; uses and maintains tools and equipment; uses scaffolding; organizes work.	10%
<b>General Masonry Practices:</b> performs substrate preparation; performs fundamental masonry tasks; uses mortars, grouts and adhesives.	19%
<b>Masonry Systems:</b> Builds masonry walls; builds horizontal masonry surfaces; builds and installs prefabricated masonry units; installs surface-bonded masonry units.	25%
<b>Natural Stone Systems:</b> builds stone walls; installs natural stone cladding.	10%
<b>Chimneys and Fireplaces:</b> builds chimneys; builds fireplaces.	10%
<b>Refractories and Corrosion Resistant Materials:</b> installs and maintains refractories; installs and maintains corrosion resistant materials.	6%
<b>Restoration:</b> rebuilds masonry work; repairs and cleans existing masonry work;	10%
<b>Additional Masonry:</b> installs glass blocks; installs ornamental and sculpted masonry; builds arches.	10%
